


### Language Access

#### Interpreter Requests

- If you have trouble speaking or understanding English **OR** need a sign language interpreter, the Court may be able to provide an interpreter for you.
- To tell the court that you need an interpreter, you can: ask court personnel, tell the judge, or e-file an interpreter request form.
- A Spanish interpreter is available in the court. Check-in with the Clerk's office when you arrive for your case.
- For all languages other than Spanish, an Interpreter Request Form must be e-filed to request an interpreter be present at future court dates.
