


The Illinois Bar Foundation (IBF) is the only statewide, voluntarily-funded grant making organization in Illinois promoting access to justice. Thanks to the support of lawyers, law firms, and businesses serving lawyers, the IBF is able to award funding to legal aid organizations across Illinois which provide fundamental civil legal services to those who would otherwise not have equal access to justice.

The IBF, throughout its long history, has sustained and helped create many organizations that provide critical legal support to vulnerable individuals throughout Illinois. Investing \$260,000 in FY24 to support 36 organizations throughout Illinois, these grants support services to those most vulnerable among us such as victims of domestic violence, families facing eviction, or asylum seekers. Our thoughtful and targeted grantmaking process is trusted by many lawyers and law firms to put their charitable dollars to good use where they are needed most.

Access to Justice Grants are awarded to organizations throughout Illinois to support the following organizational objectives:

- *Enhance the availability of civil legal aid to those of limited means *Encourage pro bono legal work
- *Educate Illinois residents about their rights and responsibilites under the law

Equip for Equality

Funded by IBF:
Special Education Rights Clinic

Equip for Equality (EFE) represented the parent of 2nd grade student who was significantly struggling in school. The school district previously denied the student's Spanish-speaking parent's request for an evaluation. EFE renewed the request for an evaluation, with a bilingual evaluator, due to Spanish being the student's home language. The school district agreed to hire an independent bilingual psychologist and bilingual speech pathologist to complete the evaluations. EFE represented the parent at the meeting to review these evaluations, determine the student's eligibility for special education, and develop an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). The resulting IEP included specialized instruction, speech and language services, and other extensive supports to ensure the student's success, now and in the future.

A story from

Chicago Alliance Against Sexual Exploitation

Funded by IBF: Legal Services for Survivors of Sexual Harm



In June of 2024, a survivor of sexual assault who is a student at a local university approached Chicago Alliance Against Sexual Exploitation (CAASE). She was being sued for defamation by her perpetrator, who was expelled as a result of her successful Title IX case against him. The return date of the defamation summons was set for a mere two weeks after our client's case was accepted, a very stiff deadline. In those two weeks, CAASE was able to contact pro bono counsel at a prestigious Chicago area private law firm to represent our client. CAASE is currently providing technical assistance in conjunction with this pro bono counsel on a motion to dismiss the defamation suit and allow this survivor to move on with both her education and her life.

Migrant & Immigrant Community Action Project

Funded by IBF:
General Operating Support for
Client Centered Services



The Migrant & Immigrant Community Action Project (MICA) worked with a client who was eligible for a U Visa, a type of visa for noncitizen victims of certain crimes who have suffered substantial mental or physical abuse and are willing to assist law enforcement in the investigation or prosecution of the criminal activity. Her case needed some extra advocacy because the certification had to be requested from an Illinois family court judge that granted her an order of protection because she was the victim of intimate partner violence from the father of her children. MICA obtained the certification and was able to submit her U Visa packet in early June 2023. All of her children are US citizens, and they are dependent on their mom. This U Visa provides her the hope of finally being able to have some sort of protection from ever having to leave her children alone and also for the chance to have work authorization and a social security number for the first time in her life.

Law Center for Better Housing

Funded by IBF:
Tenant Advocacy Project

"Hope" is the mother of a seriously ill infant. She had lived in her apartment building for some time and hoped that the management would work with her when she her ability to work was impacted by her pregnancy. However, the landlord filed an eviction and would not participate in rental assistance to help keep Hope in her home.

Law Center for Better Housing (LCBH) obtained a "pay to stay" check from the Illinois Housing Development Authority and delivered the check to the landlord. The landlord had no choice whether to accept and was compelled to dismiss its case, allowing Hope and her infant to stay in their home. LCBH also persuaded the judge to seal the eviction record and the landlord to waive some late fees. **Due to the efforts of LCBH, Hope was able to remain stably housed and focus her time and energy on taking care of herself and her child.**



The founding objective of the Illinois Bar Foundation in 1951, the Lawyers Care Fund remains at the core of our mission today.

Named after Past President Warren Lupel, this program provides financial aid to deserving members of the Illinois Bar during times of crisis, helping them pay for day-to-day necessities when they are no longer able to support themselves and their families.

The typical recipient has had a major medical or mental health crisis that prevents them from earning income. The related medical expenses often deplete savings and make maintaining a reasonable standard of living nearly impossible. The IBF offers a lifeline to help keep these attorneys and their families in their homes, buy groceries, and pay medical bills. In FY24, the IBF distributed approximately \$125,000 in financial aid to attorneys and their families in need throughout Illinois.



Bradley B. came to us for assistance during a harrowing year of medical complications following his cancer diagnosis. A young lawyer from southern Illinois, Bradley could not have anticipated that his emerging career as a social security disability attorney would be sidelined by the one-two punch of the COVID-19 pandemic and a diagnosis of abdominal wall cancer in 2021. Bradley's path to recovery was anything but straightforward, with a number of surgeries, infections and long hospital stays limiting his progress over the next two years.

Through the generosity of our donors, we were able to provide him with monthly support to help offset the costs of his ongoing medical care and living expenses as he transitioned back to work. Thankfully, Bradley is now cancer-free and has healed from the complications of his diagnosis, enabling him to get back to living his life fully, enjoying time with his family, and returning to work to fight for his clients to receive the benefits they deserve. Bradley graciously shared his story and this update to help us ensure that all attorneys in need know that we are here to help:

Since the summer of 2023, I've received good health news, but it was a long hard road to get through, and the Illinois Bar Foundation Lawyers Care Fund really helped me with that process. With all the care and help from everyone, it really helped me out of the hole that I had fallen into mentally. I would personally like to say thank you. This fund has made a significant difference in my life, helping navigate such a stressful time with a little bit of relief from the financial stress associated with my medical care. You have made a difference in my life.

In FY24, the Illinois Bar Foundation's Law School Clinic Grants supported the work of Illinois law schools and their clinics that serve the crucial role of educating and training law students to become the future of the legal profession while meeting the legal needs of the most vulnerable members of the Illinois community. There are several objectives at the heart of the newly revamped Law Clinic Grants Program that are a continuation of the work of the former Post-Graduate Civil Legal Fellowship Program:

- * Increase the amount of civil legal services available in Illinois by providing efficient and effective civil legal services by qualified lawyers and law students under their supervision.
- * Develop additional legal, interpersonal, professional, and business skills to enable the clinic participants to obtain marketable legal skills and aid in their full-time employment after law school.
- * Help the participating law students develop professional networking skills and to establish their own professional network.
- * Enhance the legal profession by instilling in a young lawyer a commitment to probono and legal aid services to be provided to all, regardless of their ability to pay.

The Illinois Bar Foundation is proud to announce \$50,000 in Law School Clinic Grants in FY24.

In 2023, Illinois JusticeCorps (ILJC) received additional funding from both AmeriCorps and the Illinois Supreme Court Commission on Access to Justice to expand to new host sites, bringing the new total to 17 sites. ILJC expanded to Adams, DeKalb, and Sangamon Counties, executing its traditional model of physically placing a JusticeCorps Fellow in one county courthouse within a judicial circuit. With the expansion, ILJC piloted a traveling model in the 1st and 4th Circuits, where a JusticeCorps Fellow travels between multiple counties within the circuit providing in person assistance across more than just one county courthouse.

As always, no matter where our Fellows and volunteers serve, ILJC provides appropriate resources and one-on-one assistance to people coming to court without lawyers. Courthouses are confusing and overwhelming places for people not familiar with the legal system, and those who receive assistance from ILJC report that they are better informed and better prepared to move forward with their cases. When court patrons were surveyed about whether their experience could have been improved, patrons overwhelmingly replied with comments such as, "I had a wonderful experience...[they] helped me find out what I need for my case," and "thank you for spending so much time with me today."









SPECIAL PROJECTS & OTHER INITIATIVES

ISBA YLD Children's Assistance Fund

Initially created to help open children's waiting rooms in courthouses across the state, the Children's Assistance Fund of the ISBA's Young Lawyers Division has since broadened its mission and today supports the ISBA YLD Internship at the Public Interest Law Initiative. This intern provides legal services to or on behalf of children at a PILI-participant legal aid agency, yielding tangible results for their agencies and the clients they serve through direct assistance, while also fostering a commitment to service and enhancing the legal aid community through the relationships and skills they build.





Jason E. Bellows Fund

In memory of her late husband, Hon. Carole Bellows created a scholarship fund to assist law school students in need. In Fiscal Year 2024, the University of Illinois College of Law received a \$2,500 grant to award one special first year law student a partial tuition scholarship.

Rural Practice Initiative

The IBF assists with the administration of the ISBA's Rural Practice Initiative, which aims to address the shortage of attorneys in rural areas of Illinois by connecting rural and small town law firms looking for law clerks and associates with law students and attorneys interested in practicing law in rural communities in Illinois.





M. Denny Hassakis Fund

Established by Mark and Janet Hassakis, the M. Denny Hassakis Fund focuses on improving the Illinois' juvenile justice system, through public policy changes and support of programs helping vulnerable youth. Recent projects include supporting criminal record expungement and sealing services at the Jefferson County Back to Work Summit with Land of Lincoln Legal Aid, supporting an Attorney Defender Panel at the James B. Moran Center for Youth Advocacy, and support for the Northwestern Prisoner Education Program






